



## Martha Angus' Nob Hill living room

Originally hung in her son's nursery, a valuable Roy Lichtenstein lithograph "Bedroom" (1991) was the motivation behind the witty living room design in Martha Angus' former Nob Hill condo. "The room wasn't large, so I wanted it to be light and airy and lots of fun," says Angus. Playing off the bold canvas, she commissioned a spunky striped-and-dotted rug from Vorwerk in Germany. Mirrored walls expand the space, catching views of the Golden Gate Bridge, and reflective coffee tables cast the room's trademark graphics onto other dimensions. Despite its pop-art flair, the decor is steeped in antiquity: a Gustavian clock and settee have roots in early 19th century Sweden.
